TALKING POINTS

PRAYER POINTS

Pray that...

- God would send/we would obey the call to go as laborers into the harvest field.
- We would be moved with compassion and not be ashamed of the gospel.

ACTION ITEMS

- Open your spiritual eyes and look at the fields of people in your life. What do you see? Be intentional to know others in your community!
- What bridges of peace can you build with others so the gospel can shared?
- What relationships do you have/need to have with others?
- Be obedient to demonstrate and share the gospel with others.
- We have the privilege to discover the customized, present way a person needs "saving" and apply the appropriate remedy. (ie comfort, inclusion, healing, etc)
- Respect other faiths, deeply held beliefs aren't easily changed. Find common ground and let love, not the law, compel the conversation.
- Say what you mean. Some words have heavy baggage.
 Casually speaking undefined and unexplained vocabulary is not thoughtful.
- Let your friends discover the truth about Jesus Christ as they discover it themselves in Scripture.
- You don't have to wait until someone asks to pray. Pray
 for someone immediately, don't just tell them you will
 pray for them. Pray for People in the moment. Almost
 any interaction with someone can lead to prayer.
- If our eyes are spiritually open, God will show us the ones he wants us to encourage through prayer and it will often lead to something more!

PRAYER POINTS

Pray that...

- The Lord will revive our understanding of the power of strategic prayer for missions
- The Lord of the Harvest to send workers to the field, even among those attending Missions Triangle
- What we have heard today would burn in our hearts
- The knowledge of the glory of the Lord will fill the earth as the waters cover the sea (Hab 2.14)
- The Lord will unite churches in the Triangle to reach our Jerusalem, Judea, Samaria and the ends of the earth

ACTION ITEMS

- Ask God to show you what he wants you to do
- Listen for God's assignment. It's going to sound impossible.
 Maybe even terrifying. That's how you know it's God talking.
- Keep specific, strategic prayer request lists for the people you influence and the work of God's Kingdom around you so you can be persistent in prayer. Write a list with this question: What are the impossible things that have to happen to do God's assignment?
- Gather together regularly for unified, persistent group prayer
- Pray expectantly
